Geographic Profile of Employment and Unemployment, 2021

About the Geographic Profiles

The Geographic Profile of Employment and Unemployment presents annual data on the employed and unemployed for states and census regions and divisions. The estimates include additional details not available in the monthly state labor force estimates such as demographic characteristics, occupation, industry, class of worker, hours of work, duration of unemployment, and reason for unemployment. These data are derived from the Current Population Survey.

Employment and Unemployment

In 2021, the labor force participation rate for men in Tennessee was 65.7 percent compared to 55.4 percent for women. Men also had a lower unemployment rate at 3.7 percent compared to 4.5 percent for women. Across racial and ethnic groups for which data is available, men of Hispanic or Latino ethnicity had the highest labor force participation rate at 81.8 percent and an unemployment rate of 4.2 percent. White men had the lowest unemployment rate at 3.1 percent in 2021. African Americans were unemployed at a rate of 7.1 percent, 6.1 percent among men of this group and 7.9 percent for women. Married men, of all races, had an unemployment rate of only 1.8 percent. The unemployment rate for the total population age 16 to 19 was 11.5 percent, and the labor force participation rate was only 38.9 percent.

Educational Attainment

Labor force participation and unemployment differs considerably by educational attainment. For the population age 25 and older in Tennessee, those with less than a high school diploma had a labor force participation rate of 36.3 percent and an unemployment rate of 8.0 percent. In contrast, those with a bachelor's

degree or higher participated in the labor force at a rate of 72.5 percent with an unemployment rate of only 1.6 percent. Just shy of one-third of the age 25 and older population had a bachelor's degree or higher (32.7 percent) while 42 percent either had less than a high school diploma or a high school diploma with no college.

Employment by Industry

Employment patterns across demographic groups also differ by industry. Among the age 16 and over population, the largest share of employment was in the education and health services sector at 21.2 percent. Men are employed in this sector at a rate of 10.1 percent compared to 33.3 percent of women. Men were most commonly employed in the manufacturing sector (14.5 percent). Black of African Americans were most commonly employed in the education and health services sector (21.2 percent), followed by transportation and utilities (15.2 percent).

Employment by Occupation

Across broad occupational groups, 27.4 percent of women's employment was in professional and related occupations, compared to 17.4 percent for men. Over onethird of employment among those of Asian descent was in this occupational group (35.6 percent), while another 26.0 percent was in service occupations. Over 60 percent of Hispanic or Latino employment was in either service (31.7 percent) or construction and extraction occupations (28.9 percent).


