According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the unemployment rate for foreignborn persons in the United States was 3.4 percent in 2022, down from 5.6 percent in 2021. The rate for native-born persons fell to 3.7 percent in 2022 from 5.3 percent in the prior year.

In 2022 there were 29.8 million foreignborn persons in the U.S. labor force, comprising 18.1 percent of the total. Hispanics accounted for 47.6 percent of the foreignborn labor force in 2022 while Asians accounted for 24.7 percent.

The foreign-born are persons who reside in the United States but who were born outside the country or one of its outlying areas to parents who were not U.S. citizens. The foreign-born include immigrants regardless of legal status, refugees, and temporary residents such as students and temporary workers.

## Labor Force Data

In 2022, the labor force participation rate of foreign-born workers was 65.9 percent while it was 61.5 percent for nativeborn workers. Among demographic groups, the participation rate of foreignborn men was77.4 percent compared to 55 percent for women. Black foreignborn people had the highest participation among racial and ethnic groups at 72.7 percent. The was the highest participation rate for any racial group across the native and foreign born population.

The foreign-born unemployment rates, in 2022, were 4.8 percent for Blacks, 3.7 percent for Hispanics, 3.4 percent for Whites, and 2.4 percent for Asians. The native-born unemployment rates, in 2022, were 6.4 percent for Blacks, 4.8 percent for Hispanics, 3.6 percent for Asians, and 2.9 percent for Whites.

## Occupation Data

In 2022, foreign-born workers were more likely than native-born workers to be employed in service occupations ( 21.6 percent versus 14.8 percent); in production,
transportation, and material moving occupations ( 15.2 percent versus 12.1 percent); and in natural resources, construction, and maintenance occupations (13.9 percent versus 7.9 percent).

The disparity was especially great among service occupations where 30.0 percent of employed foreign-born women worked in service occupations compared to 17.5 percent of employed native-born women.

Native-born workers were more likely than foreign-born workers to be employed in management, professional, and related occupations ( 44.7 percent versus 35.7 percent) and in sales and office occupations ( 20.5 percent versus 13.6 percent).

## Median Weekly Earnings

Foreign-born workers earned less than their native-born counterparts in 2022. They earned 86.9 percent of the earnings of their native-born counterparts (\$945 versus $\$ 1,087$ ). The median weekly earnings for foreign-born men ( $\$ 1,000$ ) were 84.4 percent of the earnings of nativeborn men ( $\$ 1,185$ ). The median weekly earnings for foreign-born women ( $\$ 861$ ) were 88.3 percent of the earnings of na-tive-born women (\$975).

While median earnings for the foreignborn was less than the native-born for the population as a whole, across racial and ethnic groups, only foreign-born Hispanics had a median weekly earnings less than their native-born counterparts. For-eign-born White, Black, and Asian workers all had median earnings greater than the native-born.

Foreign-born workers with a bachelor's degree or higher also had higher median earnings than the native-born. For all other levels of education, median weekly earnings were higher for the native-born.
