Annual Average Labor Force & Nonfarm Employment

The Bureau of Labor Statistics has two cooperating agreements with states to collect employment levels and unemployment data for states and sub-state areas. The Current Employment Statistics (CES) program samples approximately 142,000 businesses and government agencies representing 689,000 worksites in the U.S. The survey is done on a monthly basis by asking for an establishment's employment, hours, and earnings for the pay period that includes the 12th of each month. This data is solicited using computer assisted telephone surveys. The result is monthly nonfarm employment estimates. These estimates provide total employment, by industry, for the state and metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs). This data is compiled based on the employee's place of work.

The second cooperative agreement is the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program. The source data is obtained by the Bureau of the Census using a monthly phone survey of about 60,000 households. The data collected from this survey includes the number of persons who are currently working and/or unemployed and available to work. The results are the total employment and the unemployment percentages in the U.S., states, and sub-states areas. The LAUS program compiles data based on the employee's county of residence, rather than county of work. This is the primary reason why the total employment count differs in each program.

The monthly data for both programs are updated and revised to produce annual averages at the end of each year. Pages 2 and 3 of this edition show the annual averages for Tennessee and the four largest MSAs. The nonfarm employment provides a glimpse of growing and declining industries.

In Tennessee

The total nonfarm employment in Tennessee, from 2014 to 2018, increased by 238,200 jobs (8.4 percent). In the previous year (2017-2018) nonfarm employment increased by 49,000 jobs. During the five-year time period, the Nashville MSA accounted for 55.3 percent of the total state growth (131,800 jobs). According to the LAUS sur-

vey, which includes employees by place of residence, the Nashville employment is only 49.3 percent of the total state growth. The nonfarm employment in the four largest MSAs increased by 209,600 jobs, or 88 percent, of the state's long-term growth.

Tennessee industries with the largest growth were leisure and hospitality (up 42,400 jobs, or 14.3 percent); professional and business services (up 37,000 jobs, or 9.7 percent); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (up 21,000 jobs, or 14.1 percent); and mining, logging, and construction (up 18,200 jobs, or 16.4 percent).

The LAUS data shows that the unemployment rate decreased every year, in every area. From 2014 through 2018, nonfarm employment increased in every year in Tennessee and the four largest MSAs. The only exceptions occurred in two of the six smaller MSAs. There were employment declines in the 2018 Cleveland MSA and the 2015 Kingsport-Bristol MSA. According to the labor force estimates, the MSAs with the highest and lowest unemployment rates were Memphis (7.4 percent) and Nashville (5.2 percent). Both of these rates occurred in 2014. By 2018 the highest and lowest unemployment rates were Clarksville-Hopkinsville, KY (4.2 percent) and Nashville (2.7 percent).

U.S. Comparisons

The most recent annual average unemployment rate in the U.S. was 3.9 percent. The unemployment rate in previous years was 6.2 percent (2014); 5.3 percent (2015); 4.9 percent (2016); and 4.4 percent (2017). For the second consecutive year, Hawaii had the lowest unemployment rate (2.4 percent). In 2018, the highest unemployment rate was in Alaska (6.6 percent). Alaska has had the highest rate for the last three years.

Tennessee's ranking compared to other states unemployment rates was 21st in 2018. The previous rankings for the state were 18th (in 2017); 24th (in 2016); 32nd (in 2015); and 35th (in 2014).



Nonfarm Employment & Labor Workorce Narrative

Total nonfarm employment increased by 49,700 jobs from March 2018 to March 2019. There was a large increase in accommodation/food services (up 13,900 jobs), which includes an increase of 10,300 iobs in food services/drinking places. There were smaller increases in financial activities (up 5,400 jobs) which includes an increase of 2,900 jobs in real estate/rental/ leasing; transportation/warehousing (up 4,700 jobs); construction (up 4,500 jobs), which includes an increase of 3,900 jobs in specialty trade contractors; professional/ scientific/technical services (up 4,400 jobs); health care/social assistance (up 3,400 jobs), which includes an increase of 2,300 jobs in ambulatory health care services; local government (up 3,200 jobs), which includes an increase of 1,500 jobs in local government educational services); wholesale trade durable goods; and transportation equipment manufacturing (up 2,300 jobs). These increases were partially offset by declines of 2,400 jobs in administrative/ support/waste management, 2,000 jobs in educational services, 1,600 jobs in food/ beverage stores, and 1,000 jobs in clothing/clothing accessories stores.

During the past month, nonfarm employment had a seasonal increase of 7,100 jobs. There were increases in accommodation/food services (up 3,500 jobs), which includes an increase of 2,900 jobs in food services/drinking places; construction (up 2,400 jobs), which includes an increase of 1,600 jobs in specialty trade contractors arts/recreation/entertainment (up 1,900 jobs); building materials/garden supply stores (up 1,300 jobs); and local government educational services (up 1,100 jobs).

Tennessee's seasonally adjusted estimated unemployment rate for March 2019 was 3.2 percent, unchanged point from the February 2019 rate. The United States unemployment rate for February 2019 was 3.8 percent, also unchanged from the previous month. In February 2018, the U.S. seasonally adjusted rate was 4.0 percent while the state rate was 3.6 percent.

The not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased in 17 counties, increased in 69 counties, and remained the same in nine counties. Williamson County had the lowest rate at 2.4 percent, down 0.3 percent from the February rate. The highest rate was Clay County at 6.0 percent, up from 5.3 percent.

The data from all the nonfarm employment estimates tables include all full- and part-time nonfarm wage and salary employees who worked during or received pay for any part of the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. This is a count of jobs by place of work. Agricultural workers, proprietors, self-employed persons, workers in private households, and unpaid family workers are excluded. These numbers may not add due to rounding. Data are based on the 2018 benchmark.



Total nonfarm employment in the Chattanooga MSA increased by 2,000 jobs from February 2019 to March 2019. There were increases in leisure/hospitality and educational/health services (both up 600 jobs), retail trade (up 300 jobs), and local government (up 200 jobs). During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 3,600 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,100 while service-providing jobs increased by 2,500.

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
Knoxville MSA

Total nonfarm employment in Knoxville increased by 2,000 jobs from February 2019 to March 2019. There were increases in leisure/hospitality (up 1.200 jobs), professional/business services (up 500 jobs), and local government (up 300 jobs). There was a 200 job increase in retail trade, and durable goods manufacturing.

These increases were partially offset by declines of 400 jobs in state government and 200 jobs in educational and health services.

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 9,000 jobs. During the year, goods-producing jobs increased by 1,400 while service-providing jobs increased by 7,600.



Total nonfarm employment decreased by 1,500 jobs from February 2019 to March 2019. There were declines in trade/ transportation/utilities (down 1,500 jobs), which includes a drop of 1,100 jobs in wholesale trade; administrative/support/ waste management (down 1,100 jobs); and leisure/hospitality and manufacturing (both down 400 jobs).

These were partially offset by increases of 600 jobs in educational/health services, 500 jobs in financial activities, 300 jobs in both mining/logging/construction and professional/scientific/technical services, and 200 jobs in local government.



Total nonfarm employment increased by 1,300 jobs from February 2019 to March 2019. There were increases in leisure/hospitality and administrative/support/waste management (both up 1,300 jobs); mining/logging/construction (up 700 jobs); and government (up 400 jobs), which includes increases of 200 jobs in both state and local government.

These increases were partially offset by declines in professional/scientific services (down 900 jobs); wholesale trade (down 800 jobs); durable goods manufacturing and other services (both down 300 jobs); and retail trade and information (both down 200 jobs).

During the past 12 months, nonfarm employment increased by 26,000 jobs. During that time, goods-producing jobs increased by 2,900, while service-providing jobs increased by 23,100.
