\* \* \* \* \* \* 1 2 CHAIRMAN FOX: I appreciate 3 everyone being here. This will probably be a 4 quick meeting, but we'll go ahead and call the 5 September 7th, 2022 meeting of the Elevator and 6 Amusement Device Safety Board to order. 7 Mr. Herrod, are there any 8 announcements or instructions or whatever that we 9 need to make? 10 MR. HERROD: No, sir. I can't 11 think of any at this time. 12 CHAIRMAN FOX: All right. 1.3 Then the next item would be adoption of the 14 agenda. I would ask for a motion to adopt the 15 agenda as presented. 16 MS. O'CONNOR: I'll make the motion to adopt the agenda. 17 18 MR. HALE: I'll second. 19 CHAIRMAN FOX: We have a 20 motion and a second. Any discussion? 21 (No verbal response.) 2.2 MR. HALE: Hearing none, all 23 in favor of the motion, let it be known by saying 24 "aye." 25 (Affirmative Response.)

1 CHAIRMAN FOX: We probably 2 ought to do a roll call. No, we're good on that. 3 Well, let's ask Ms. Nan. Do we need a roll call? 4 5 MS. GEORGE: Cassandra, would 6 you like the roll call? 7 THE REPORTER: No, not unless 8 there's a --9 MS. GEORGE: If everyone would 10 just put their names and who they represent in the 11 chat box, that would be sufficient. Cassandra, 12 for you would it? 1.3 THE REPORTER: I think 14 regarding a roll call, unless there's a "nay," if 15 everybody is in agreement, then I can just say 16 "affirmative response." 17 CHAIRMAN FOX: Okay. Moving 18 forward, the Elevator Unit report. 19 MS. DIEFENBACH: Do we need to 20 approve the minutes first, or did I miss that? 21 CHAIRMAN FOX: I'm sorry? 2.2 Repeat. 23 MS. DIEFENBACH: Approving the 24 minutes. 25 MR. HERROD: Yes.

1 CHAIRMAN FOX: Oh, I'm sorry. 2 I skipped one, in a hurry. 3 Do we have a motion to approve the 4 minutes of the June 7th, 2022 meeting? 5 MS. O'CONNOR: So moved. 6 MR. RADER: Second. 7 CHAIRMAN FOX: Okay. We have a motion and a second. Ms. O'Connor made the 8 9 motion; Mr. Raider seconded it. Any discussion? 10 (No verbal response.) 11 CHAIRMAN FOX: Hearing none, 12 all in favor of the motion, let it be known by 1.3 saying "aye." 14 (Affirmative response.) 15 CHAIRMAN FOX: All opposed, like sign. 16 17 (No verbal response.) 18 CHAIRMAN FOX: Motion carries. 19 Elevator Unit report. 20 MR. MCPHERSON: Yes, sir. 21 This is Mike McPherson, Chief Elevator Inspector. 2.2 I'll give you a few stats. We have a total now of 23 16,098 conveyances across the state. The Elevator 24 Unit has completed over 19,985 inspections across 25 the state. We've approved over 426 -- we only

1 have 426 permits now that we approved that are 2 conveyances being altered or under new 3 construction. 4 We have 28 total inspectors, and we 5 are going to hire actually another one that starts 6 the 1st of October. Also, we're looking to hire 7 more inspectors and another assistant inspector as 8 well. 9 Our delinquency rate is always our 10 biggest focus right now outside of safety. And we 11 have been working overtime, being allowed to do so 12 with some inspectors of the area. And also being 1.3 able to hire a few more inspectors has really 14 helped us catch up quite a bit. 15 We see there on the slides up there 16 it shows our growth. We're still growing here in 17 Tennessee, and also, mainly, the Nashville area is 18 still popping. 19 Accident-wise, we've had about a 20 dozen responded to as being reported as other than 21 serious. It's just typical, you know, an 2.2 escalator, getting on and off or tripping up over 23 a suitcase or what have you. 24 Of course, back in July, we did have 25 the Anakeesta incident out there which we

1	responded to. The law enforcement was there and
2	the staff of Anakeesta really moved swiftly to
3	take care of that professionally and very quickly.
4	And we needed equipment just to make sure that it
5	was not an equipment-type failure. As we know,
6	they did rule this as a suicide.
7	If anyone has got any questions, I'll
8	be happy to answer anything you've got.
9	CHAIRMAN FOX: Any questions
10	from the Board?
11	(No verbal response.)
12	CHAIRMAN FOX: Okay. Moving
13	right along. The Amusement Device Unit report.
14	MR. HARDY: Thank you, Jamie,
15	for providing slides for us.
16	The first slide you'll see is kind of
17	two-part. It shows our new ending number of
18	operating permits issued. We were at 425, which
19	is the most operating permits that we've issued
20	since our record year of 2019. So the indication
21	to us in our industry, it's bouncing back.
22	So far in 2023, we've issued
23	72 operating permits, and I left the 2023
24	projection at 425. It's kind of early in the year
25	to prorate that out, but I'm confident that we'll

1 see at least what we did last year if not more, 2 hopefully to get closer to that 2019 number. 3 CHAIRMAN FOX: Okay. 4 MR. HARDY: New operating 5 permits issued, we finished up the fiscal year of 6 '22 with 76 new companies. And again, that's a 7 bounce-back in comparison to 2020 and 2021 COVID 8 years. We have issued 25 new operating permits to 9 new companies thus far this year, and we're going 10 to project that 76 and hopefully improve on that 11 number for 2023. 12 Total devices inspected, we were at 13 3,819 for 2022. We'll keep that projection for 14 2023, and we have collected 697 inspections for 15 the individual devices so far this year. 16 We ended the year last year with six 17 reportable accidents. It was up slightly from '21 18 and also 2020. We're nine, ten weeks in our 19 fiscal year thus far, and we have reported no 20 reportable accidents on amusement devices this 21 year. 2.2 And again, you'll see zero for 2023. 23 The 2022 numbers are kind of broken down by 24 device. We talked about this in the previous meetings. I don't think we've had one since our 25 Stone & George Court Reporting

1 last board meeting, but 2022 breaks down to six 2 total reportable accidents that we recorded in the 3 last fiscal year.

4 And the last thing, at the last June 5 meeting, we talked a little bit about Dollywood's 6 activity regarding the Drop Tower accident in 7 Orlando last March. And to update that report, 8 Dollywood's Dropline device reopened on Friday, 9 August the 12th. They added seatbelt restraints, 10 which was a recommendation of the manufacturer, 11 and made a height requirement change and some 12 related signage revisions. And to our knowledge, 1.3 there have been no issues with the Drop Tower --14 Dropline device in Dollywood since reopening in 15 August. 16 I would also like to mention that

17 fair season has been going well for us. It's been 18 a busy time. David plays a big part in the Wilson 19 County and Tennessee State Fair. And they 20 reported a record attendance of 776,195 patrons 21 this year. That was up 300,000 from 2021 and 2.2 200,000 from the previous record set in 2013. So 23 that's another indicater that our industry is 24 bouncing back. 25 We're approaching the end of fair

1 season, which will be ending in October. So far, 2 it's been fast and furious, but we've been able to 3 capture and verify all the devices that are at the 4 local fairs and festivals, and the compliance 5 officers have done a good job with their on-site 6 inspections and audits. 7 And again, if you have any questions 8 for the Amusement Device Unit, I'll be glad to 9 answer any of those you might have. 10 CHAIRMAN FOX: Any questions 11 from the Board? 12 MR. HALE: Mr. Chair, I just 13 want to say I really appreciate the efforts that 14 our amusement device staff put forward in 15 inspecting and getting the Tennessee State Fair, 16 Wilson County Fair up and going. And I just can't 17 say enough good about it. 18 CHAIRMAN FOX: Good deal. 19 Thank you. 20 MR. HARDY: Thank you, 21 Mr. Hale. 2.2 CHAIRMAN FOX: Anyone else? 23 MR. HARDY: That's all I had. 24 CHAIRMAN FOX: Okay. Moving 25 right along. Old business, we have none. New

1 business, open discussion. Can we -- Mr. Hardy, 2 can we get you to talk about the Dropline tower 3 accident? I quess it was in India. 4 MR. HARDY: Yes, sir. About 5 that, from what I've seen on the internet, I saw 6 something about a cable break. But I really 7 haven't dug that deep into it to see where they 8 are. I believe that accident occurred over last 9 weekend. 10 CHAIRMAN FOX: Yes, it did. 11 Do we know the manufacturer? At this 12 MR. HARDY: I do not. 13 time, I do not know the manufacturer. I know 14 there were 16 injuries and no fatalities the last 15 news report that I was able to look at. We'll be 16 looking at that and seeing what I can find, see if 17 it was the same manufacturer as the one that 18 Dollywood has and the one at Orlando. 19 CHAIRMAN FOX: Okay. Anything 20 from the board members or staff? 21 MR. POPE: Can you hear me there, Chairman? 2.2 23 CHAIRMAN FOX: Yes, sir. 24 MR. POPE: Everything that I 25 heard, like he said, was on the internet. But it

1	said it was like a knockoff manufacturer. It was
2	a copy of another ride another company had built
3	in India, maybe a Chinese company, is what I'm
4	hearing. But I don't know that that's a fact.
5	But it was a terrible-looking accident on the
6	internet. I'm hoping that doesn't have any
7	reflection on anything in the United States.
8	CHAIRMAN FOX: Me too.
9	MR. HARDY: Me three.
10	CHAIRMAN FOX: Okay. Anything
11	else for the good of the order on there?
12	(No verbal response.)
13	CHAIRMAN FOX: All right. Our
14	next meeting is scheduled for December the 6th,
15	2022, 9:00 a.m. Central Standard Time.
16	Do I have a motion for adjournment?
17	MR. POPE: Motion. James Roy
18	Pope.
19	MR. HALE: Will it be an
20	in-person meeting or another virtual? Do you
21	know, Mr. Chair?
22	CHAIRMAN FOX: I do not.
23	Mr. Herrod may be able to tell us.
