At that point we'll take the survey results and compile it, enter it into an Excel spreadsheet and determine the prevailing wage recommended rates. And then after that, the Commission will come back together to discuss the survey data and propose rates on November the 14th.

After some period of time, two weeks later, we will come back again for a short meeting to finalize, approve the rates for each classification.

Also attached is the survey form with the 25 classifications. Last year, we made just some minor changes to the survey to describe the truck drivers two, three, four, and five axles.

Those were classifications 21, 22, and 23, just to say "on highway." Nothing else changed on that survey.

Last year we sent out to 196
companies. We got 93 companies to respond, which
was 46 percent, which was pretty good since it's a
voluntary survey. This year we'll be sending out

to at least 250 companies. Those are the number of companies that have current contracts with TDOT. That's what's been supplied to TDOT. Kent Starwalt will help us with any other companies that he knows of that may have contracts that we don't have their names, and we will send those out.

letter with the explanations on it and an example of what we're looking for. The companies will be asked to just fill in the number of employees, total hours worked, and the hourly wage. That is not -- does not include any benefits or overtime. It's just straight wage hours. And we will come up with a weighted average for all of that, and then that will go into the calculation for the prevailing wage and the percent increase that we can have.

One of the last attachments you have are all the companies involved with TDOT contracts at this time. If you're familiar with TDOT contracts, the next-to-the-last handout shows a sample one with the contract number -- "CN" for contract number -- and then a letter associated with it, VWXYZ, depending on the year. "V" was
