

**PUBLIC NOTICE
OF A PUBLIC HEARING
AND THE PROPOSED REISSUANCE OF A HAZARDOUS
WASTE MANAGEMENT PERMIT TO
CLEAN HARBORS TENNESSEE, LLC**

The Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation's (TDEC) Division of Solid Waste Management (DSWM) will conduct a **public hearing at 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, September 22, 2009, in the library of the Greenbrier Elementary School, located at 2658 Highway 41 South, Greenbrier, TN 37073**, to receive comments on DSWM's proposed permit. DSWM proposes to reissue a hazardous waste management permit to Clean Harbors Tennessee, LLC that would allow the facility to continue to operate an existing hazardous waste storage and treatment facility. This action follows the pre-application public meeting conducted by the facility on March 6, 2006, as required by Rule 1200-1-11-.07(2)(c)3(i). No members of the community attended the public meeting.

From 6:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., citizens are invited to inspect and discuss the draft permit, [Fact Sheet](#), and other materials with representatives from DSWM and Clean Harbors. The formal part of the hearing will begin at 6:30 p.m. DSWM will explain its tentative decision to issue the permit after which Clean Harbors will describe the facility's operations. Oral and/or written comments on the draft permit will then be received from the public. There will also be an opportunity for public comments to be taped or written and submitted from 6:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Clean Harbors (EPA ID Number: TND 00 064 5770), [located at 2815 Old Greenbrier Pike in Greenbrier, Robertson County, TN 37073-4514](#), is currently permitted under Tennessee Permit Number TNHW-093. The original permit (TNHW-005), issued on May 3, 1985, was subsequently reissued on September 20, 1996. The current permit was effective for ten years.

Clean Harbors submitted a Part A and Part B Application to DSWM for renewal of the facility's hazardous waste management permit on March 17, 2006, thus enabling the facility to continue to operate under the current permit until a final decision is made. The receipt of the renewal application was public noticed on April 5, 2006. The current permit allows the facility to store hazardous waste in four container storage areas with a total maximum storage capacity of 200,000 gallons and to treat hazardous waste through chemical fixation, bulking, and blending with a total maximum treatment capacity of 20,000 gallons/day. The proposed permit is for the continuance of these storage and treatment units with one additional container storage unit. The storage and treatment capacities will remain the same. The proposed permit also requires Clean Harbors to notify of imminent hazards, and when applicable, comply with the requirements developed under land disposal restrictions and organic air emission standards. A Fact Sheet has been prepared that summarizes the draft permit requirements. If issued, the permit would be effective for ten years.

Also included as part of this draft permit are the corrective action conditions for the solid waste management units (SWMUs) and areas of concern (AOCs). Clean Harbors will be required to investigate any releases of hazardous waste or hazardous constituents at the facility, regardless of the time at which waste was placed in a unit, and to take appropriate corrective action for any such releases. Currently, the SWMUs and AOCs do not require any further action.

The permit is proposed to be reissued under the authority of the Tennessee Hazardous Waste Management Act of 1977, as amended, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-212-101 et seq., and Rule Chapter 1200-1-11, Hazardous Waste Management.

Gass Blvd., Nashville, TN 37243 (615-687-7000), and at DSWM's Central Office, 5th Floor, L & C Tower, 401 Church Street, Nashville, TN 37243-1535 (615-532-0780).

The comments must be received by 4:30 p.m., September 28, 2009, to assure consideration. After considering all public comments received, the DSWM Director will issue a final permit decision and a Response to Comments.
