WHEREAS, From time to time, the members of this General Assembly have seen fit to name certain highways and bridges to honor those exemplary public servants who have contributed significantly to the growth and prosperity of their respective communities; and

WHEREAS, No Tennessean is more deserving of this honor than Clarence J. Rutherford of Sullivan County; and

WHEREAS, Clarence J. Rutherford is a person of impeccable morals and irreproachable integrity whose astute community involvement has always been for the express purpose of helping his fellow citizens of Sullivan County to lead happier and more productive lives; and

WHEREAS, He has served his fellow citizens faithfully and energetically in numerous other capacities and he has selflessly devoted his time and energies to making Sullivan County a better place to live; and

WHEREAS, The Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners has memorialized this

body to name a certain bridge on State Route 394 to permanently commemorate Mr. Rutherford's bountiful life of purpose and commitment; and

WHEREAS, This General Assembly most heartily concurs with this excellent proposal; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, That the bridge on State Route 394 (Bristol Beltway) that spans State Route 358 (Weaver Pike) in Sullivan County is hereby designated as the "Clarence J. Rutherford Bridge" to honor one of the most dedicated and public-spirited citizens the Volunteer State has ever produced.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Transportation is directed to erect suitable signs or to affix suitable markers designating such bridge as the "Clarence J. Rutherford Bridge".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the erection of such signs shall be within the guidelines prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution shall become operative only if the Federal Highway Administrator advises the Commissioner of Transportation in writing that the provisions of this resolution shall not render Tennessee in violation of federal laws and regulations and subject to penalties prescribed therein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in addition to the requirements of the preceding resolving clause, this resolution shall become operative only if Sullivan County, Tennessee, either (1) remits the estimated cost of the erection of such signs to the Department of Transportation within one (1) year of the effective date of this resolution, or (2) manufactures and erects such signs pursuant to state and federal guidelines and as approved by the Department. If electing option (1), Sullivan County shall make such payment prior to any expenditure by the State for manufacture or installation of such signs. The Department shall return any unused portion of the estimated cost to Sullivan County within thirty (30) days of the erection of such signs. If the actual cost exceeds the estimated cost, Sullivan County shall remit an amount equal to the difference in such costs to the Department within thirty (30) days of receiving an itemized invoice of the actual cost from the Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That an enrolled copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Commissioner of Transportation and to the Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 445

By Ramsey

A RESOLUTION To designate a segment of State Route 126 in Blountville, Sullivan County as the "Great Stage Road".

WHEREAS, The original Great Stage Road made Blountville, in Sullivan County, a center of trade and migration for eighty years; and

WHEREAS, Early roads in the territory and the State were old buffalo trails or Indian paths leading west and south from Pennsylvania to Virginia; and

WHEREAS, The first road was the Island Road that led into Sullivan County to the Holston River; and

WHEREAS, This road by-passed Blountville, but in 1795, the road was re-routed and named the Stage Road; and

WHEREAS, The Great Stage Road made Blountville a major terminus for the tens of thousands of settlers who were moving westward over the Appalachians; and

WHEREAS, On this road traveled Andrew Jackson, William McKinley, the Marquis de Lafayette, and Louis Phillipe, the exiled King of France; and

WHEREAS, When the owner of Rotherwood, Frederick A. Ross, arrived on the Great Stage Road he wrote in his journal about readying himself to enter "Blountville the first town in Tennessee"; and

WHEREAS, The Great Stage Road was the major route for the largest western movement in the history of the Republic; and

WHEREAS, The Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners has memorialized this body to name a segment of State Route 126 (Main Street) in Blountville to permanently commemorate the important role that the Great Stage Road has played in the panoramic history of Blountville, Sullivan County and the great State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, This General Assembly most heartily concurs with this excellent proposal to appropriately recognize the importance of the Great Stage Road in Sullivan County and Blountville, the county seat; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, That the segment of State Route 126 (Main Street) in Blountville, Sullivan County from such route's intersection with State Route 394 to its intersection with Blountville Boulevard is hereby designated as the "Great Stage Road" to raise awareness of this historic road's landmark status in the early history and settlement of Sullivan County and the State of Tennessee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Transportation is directed to erect suitable signs or to affix suitable markers designating such segment of State Route 126 as the "Great Stage Road".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the erection of such signs shall be within the guidelines prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution shall become operative only if the Federal Highway Administrator advises the Commissioner of Transportation in writing that the provisions of this resolution shall not render Tennessee in violation of federal laws and regulations and subject to penalties prescribed therein.



A RESOLUTION To designate a bridge on State Route 44 in Sullivan County as the "PFC Dave C. Hinkle Memorial Bridge".

WHEREAS, Since the birth of our great nation, hundreds of thousands of brave American men and women have served their country in the armed forces, defending the most inviolate principles of human freedom and democracy; and

WHEREAS, One such person was PFC Dave C. Hinkle, who was killed in combat action in Italy on May 31, 1944 during World War II, while serving with the 337th Regiment, 88th Division, United States Army; and

WHEREAS, PFC Hinkle was the only native son from the Hickory Tree Community killed in action during World War II; and

WHEREAS, The Sullivan County Board of County Commissioners has requested this body to name a certain bridge on State Route 44 in the Hickory Tree Community to memorialize this distinguished Tennessean, who made the ultimate sacrifice to preserve the blessed freedoms we enjoy today and that our progeny will hopefully continue to cherish for generations to come; and

WHEREAS, This General Assembly most heartily concurs with this excellent proposal honoring the memory of PFC Hinkle for his heroic service to Tennessee and our Country; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, That the bridge on State Route 44 in the Hickory Tree Community is hereby designated the "PFC Dave C. Hinkle Memorial Bridge" as a memorial to his valiant service.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Transportation is directed to erect suitable signs or to affix suitable markers designating such bridge on State Route 44 as the "PFC Dave C. Hinkle Memorial Bridge".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the erection of such signs shall be within the guidelines prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.




