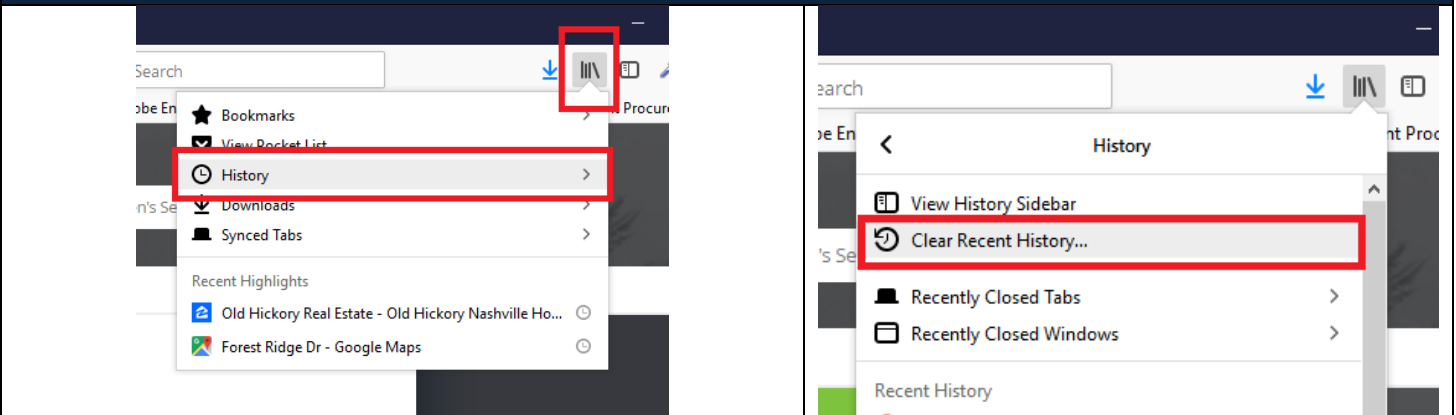


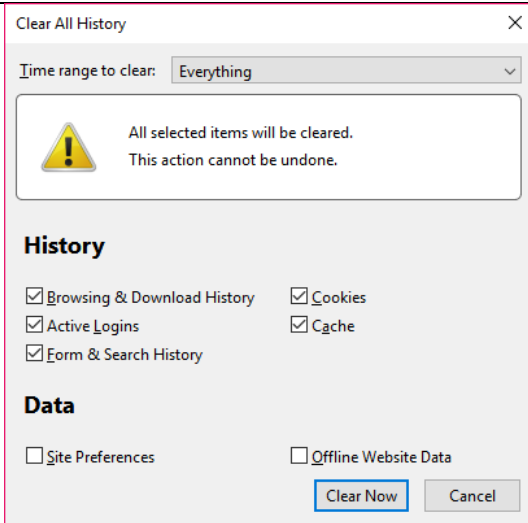

2. **Click** on "History"

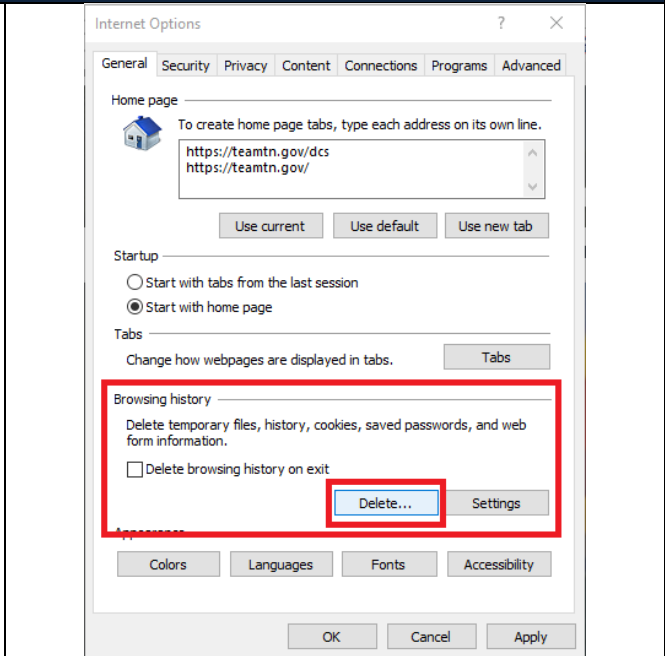
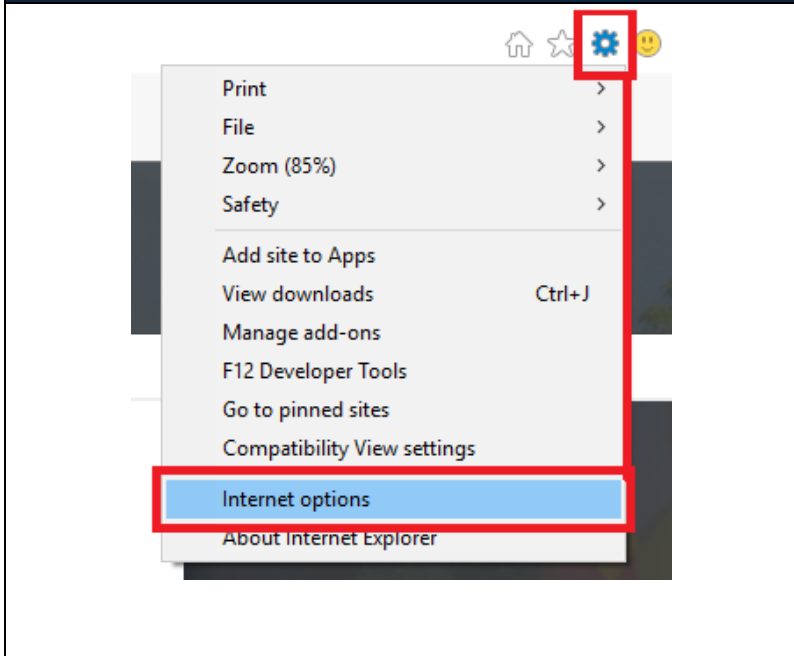
3. **Click** "Clear Recent History..."



4. A box will appear. Make sure everything that you see in the image is **checked** and then **click** "Clear Now"

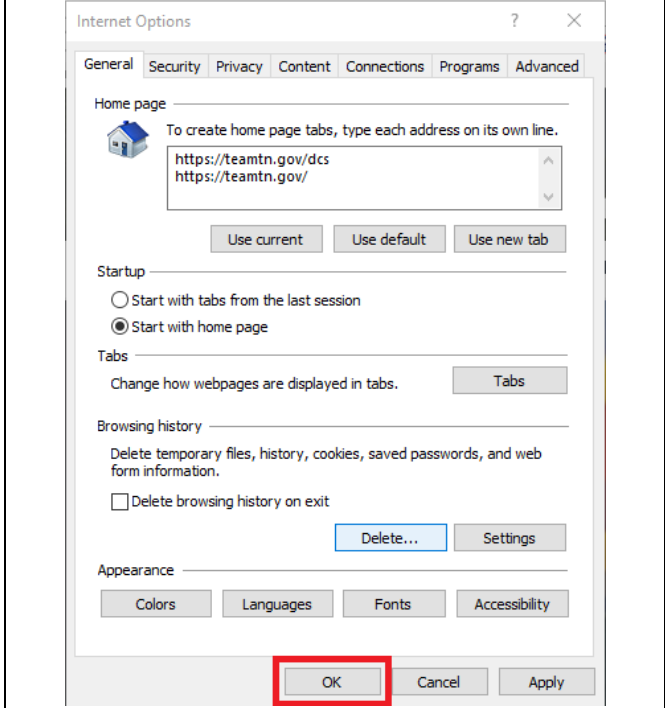
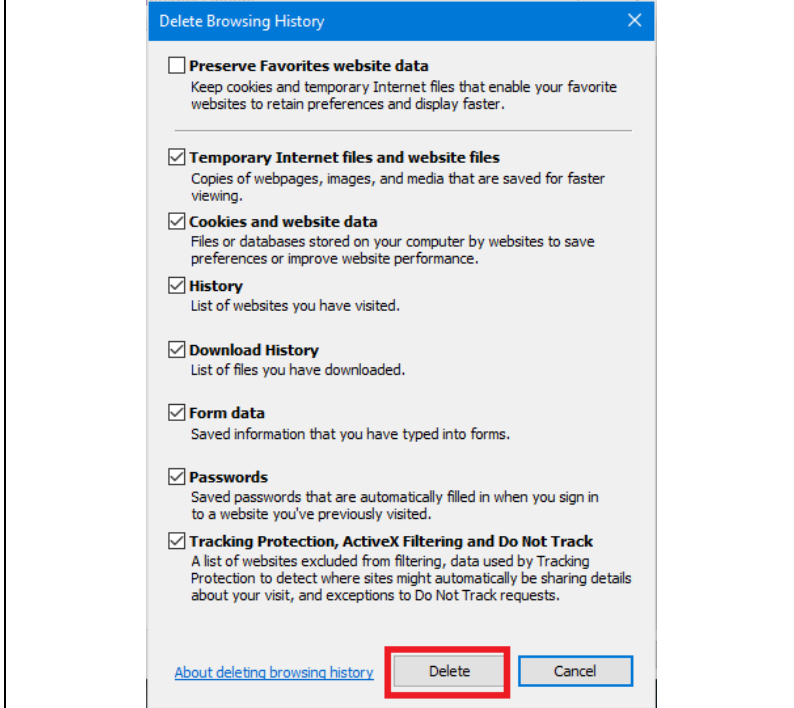
5. Completely close and reopen Firefox.

Internet Explorer






1. **Click** on the gear icon in the top right corner.

5. **Click** "Ok" on the previous box.
6. Completely close and reopen Internet Explorer.
