**SUBJECT: 2021-22 Safe Schools Report**

The Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act of 2007, now codified as T.C.A. § 49-6-801-816, provides that the Commissioner of Education annually report to the governor and General Assembly on implementation of the Act. Additionally, T.C.A. § 49-6-4301(e) requires the commissioner to report on “the prevalence of violent and disruptive incidents in the public schools, and the effectiveness of school programs undertaken to reduce violence and assure the safety and security of students and school personnel.”

The attached report provides a summary of serious incidents occurring within Tennessee schools during the 2021-22 school year, as well as an overview of efforts currently undertaken to ensure the safety of our students and staff.

# Executive Summary

T.C.A § 49-6-810 requires the Commissioner of Education to report annually to the Governor and General Assembly on implementation and compliance with the Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) Act. Additionally, T.C.A. § 49-6-4301(e) requires the commissioner to report on “the prevalence of violent and disruptive incidents in the public schools, and the effectiveness of school programs undertaken to reduce violence and assure the safety and security of students and school personnel.” The 2021-22 school year brought about new challenges with the return to school during the COVID-19 pandemic, and school safety expanded supports to schools.

After the Uvalde tragedy on May 24, 2022, Governor Bill Lee signed [Executive Order 97](#) and initiated an Enhanced School Safety Working Group comprised of leaders within the Tennessee Department of Education, Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security, Department of Mental Health, Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance, Tennessee Emergency Management Agency and the Governor’s Office. This group meets bi-monthly to determine action steps to improve school safety across Tennessee. Action steps have included developing more resources for parents to engage in school safety, increased trainings for schools on safety best practices, refinement of emergency operation plan templates and increased coordination with local law enforcement.

# Emergency Preparedness

## ***Emergency Operation Planning***

The SAVE Act, passed in 2007, established specific and consistent requirements for districts related to providing a safe school environment, including the formation of district and school safety teams and requirements for the development of comprehensive safety plans. These plans, referred to as emergency operation plans (EOPs), outline how schools prepare for, respond to, and recover from emergencies. A well-developed and well-documented EOP ensures that plans and procedures are comprehensive and are communicated to everyone with a potential role during emergency situations.

It is important to note here the difference between a district and a school EOP. District EOPs set the stage for school-level EOPs by providing standards and, where appropriate, uniform response protocols. District EOPs also ensure that adequate and appropriate planning occurs with the broader school community and that district-level resources will be directed to support schools when needed. School-level EOPs provide the individually tailored planning, support and direction needed to address the unique needs of each school.

District and school EOPs are reviewed on a [five-year cycle](#) that coincides with their county emergency management planning cycle. EOP reviews are conducted using an evaluation rubric that is aligned with EOP requirements identified in T.C.A § 49-6-805.

During the 2021-22 school year, 28 district EOPs were reviewed with the following findings:

### ***Conducting Emergency Drills***

Training on school safety principles provides school personnel techniques for identifying strategies to prevent or mitigate threats and hazards, respond to emergencies and to ultimately recover from a crisis. Students are trained on emergency procedures, and emergency drills provide an opportunity to identify gaps in the training. The current drill requirements for schools are outlined in the table below:

Drill	Description
<b>Fire Drill</b>	Fire drills requiring full evacuation shall be held at least one (1) time every thirty (30) <b>SCHOOL DAYS</b> , with two (2) fire drills occurring during the first thirty (30) full days of the school year. Additionally, four (4) fire safety educational announcements will be conducted throughout the year. T.C.A. § 68-102-137(b).

<b>Intruder Drill</b>	Each school shall conduct at least one (1) armed intruder drill annually. The drill shall be conducted in coordination with the appropriate local law enforcement agency. T.C.A. § 49-6-807.
<b>CPR/AED Drill</b>	Each school having one (1) or more AEDs shall schedule annual CPR/AED training for junior and high school students and conduct an annual CPR and AED drill. T.C.A. § 49-6-1208.
<b>Additional Drills</b>	Each school shall conduct three (3) additional drills, not requiring full evacuation, during each school year. (T.C.A. § 68-102-137(f).  Each school administered by a local education agency (LEA) having jurisdiction that lies entirely or partially within 100 miles of the New Madrid Fault Line shall conduct at least two (2) earthquake preparedness drills (drop, cover, hold) annually. State Board of Education Rule 0520-01-02-.30(b) SCHOOL SAFETY.

In addition to reviewing EOPs, 2020-21 school year drill logs were also reviewed. Although the school year was disrupted by the pandemic, schools were able to conduct many of the required drills prior to closing. 392 drill logs were reviewed during the most recent review cycle indicating the following:

## ***School Resource Officers***

The 111<sup>th</sup> General Assembly amended T.C.A § 49-6-809 to prioritize the placement of school resource officers in Tennessee schools. For FY20, the General Assembly appropriated an additional \$20 million in one-time Safe Schools funding to support the placement of school resource officers (SROs) in schools across the state that did not have a full-time officer in place during the previous school year. The intent of this one-time grant was to assist local governments until they could sustain their SROs with their own funding sources.

During the 2019-20 school year, the department awarded \$7,466,700 for 213 new, full-time SROs in 57 LEAs. The 57 LEAs awarded funding during the 2019-20 school year were allowed to apply for a second year of funds and 51 of those LEAs reapplied. During the 2020-21 school year, the department awarded \$6,811,378 to support 195 school resource officers during the 2020-21 school year. Six LEAs did not reapply as their partner law enforcement agency was unable to recruit or place an officer within the current pandemic environment. During the 2021-22 school year, the department awarded \$6,650,000 for 190 school resource officers in 51 LEAs.

The department will continue to work closely with the Department of Safety and Homeland Security to identify strategies to increase SRO placement with grant funds. Information about school resource officer grant funding can be found in [Appendix I](#).

The table below reflects a four-year trend in the number of SROs and the percentage of SROs at each grade band in schools.

## ***School Safety Grant Programs***

The department currently administers two grant programs to support school safety—the Safe Schools Grant and the School Resource Officer (SRO) Grant.



## Grant Program Overviews

### *Safe Schools (Recurring)*

- **Purpose:** Districts are required to use the results of a school security assessment developed by the Department of Safety and Homeland Security as a needs analysis to drive the use of grant funds. Alignment with identified needs is validated during the grant approval process. Information about district level funding, including how these funds are being utilized can be found in [Appendix II](#).
  
- **Awards:** Grants are awarded to all districts in proportion to their relative share of the BEP formula. Districts are required to provide a 25% local match that is adjusted for fiscal capacity.
  
- **Appropriations:**
  - FY18: \$4.8M in recurring funding
  - FY19: \$10M in recurring funding
  - FY20: \$20M in recurring funding
  - FY21: \$20M in recurring funding
  - FY22: \$20M in recurring funding

### *SRO Grant (Non-Recurring)*

- **Purpose:** Grant funds are limited to supporting the placement, training, or equipment for full-time SROs in schools that did not have a full-time SRO in the prior year. Information about district level funding can be found in [Appendix II](#).
  
- **Awards:** Any Tennessee school district may apply. Grants are in the amount of \$35,000 per SRO and require a 25% local match that is adjusted for fiscal capacity.
  
- **Appropriation:** The grant program was set up for two years with the non-recurring FY20 appropriation of \$20M in Safe Schools funding. Both grant program years are supported with this one-time appropriation.

## ***Grants to States for Emergency Management***

In October 2018, the department was awarded a five-year U.S. Department of Education grant for the purpose of expanding the state's capacity to assist schools in the development and implementation of high-quality EOPs. During the 2021-22 school year, the following objectives were addressed:

**Objective A:** Expand training and support to LEAs through staffing infrastructure within the department, as well as contractual support to enable the Tennessee School Safety Center to transition to a force multiplier model via the use of training of trainers to reach a larger and more diverse target population.

- We also have **9 School Safety Mentors who are trained trainers** in Developing High-Quality EOPs, Reunification, Psychological and Emotional Recovery, PREPARE Postvention, Active Shooter training and Threat Assessment. - Transportation Safety
- The mentors have **provided technical assistance** in the areas of EOP Development, Threat Assessment Consultation, Memorandum of Understanding, PREPARE Postvention, SRO trainings, standards, qualifications and best practices, access and functional needs, NIMS, reunification, signs and symptoms of mental health challenges in youth and restorative practices.
- **The mentors have also provided the following trainings:**
  - Threat Assessment (at the district level and school level)
  - Restorative Practices
  - EOP Development (at the district level and school level)
  - Averting Targeted School Violence
  - PREPARE Postvention
  - School Climate and Safety Trends

- **Training Evaluations** (total of 530) indicate the following:
  - 93% Strongly Agree or Agree that the training session covered information they anticipated learning.
  - 97% Strongly Agree or Agree that the training session enhanced their knowledge and/or skills.
  - 96% Strongly Agree or Agree that the instructor’s presentation skills were approachable, clear and effective.
  - 97% Strongly Agree or Agree that the instructor demonstrated knowledge of the material presented.
  - 96% Strongly Agree or Agree that they think the training would be beneficial to others in the future.

- A **needs assessment survey** conducted in February 2022 with each LEA’s Safe Schools Coordinator indicated the following needs or requests:
  - 30 LEAs requested EOP Development training
  - 19 LEAs requested training in Security Practices and Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED)
  - 22 LEAs requested training in Security Assessments
  - 37 LEAs requested training in Threat Assessment
  - 23 LEAs requested training in School Resource Officer Standards, Qualifications, Training and MOUs.
  - 17 LEAs requested training in Suicide Prevention
- **Community Practice/ Feedback Calls** were conducted in September to obtain feedback on Emergency Operations Plan Templates and Security Assessment Tools indicated the following feedback:
  - District level safety staff are concerned School level staff are not taking it seriously. District level staff prefer to participate in school level security assessments.
  - School Security Assessment training should be more educator oriented.
  - District summaries of security assessments are helpful in determining the needs of the district.
  - The school-level EOP template is too detailed and difficult to navigate. The school-level template needs to be simplified and needs pull-out reference sheets for all school staff (teachers, bus drivers, cafeteria workers, parents etc.).

**Objective B:** Create training, curriculum and technology supports that enable LEAs to effectively monitor and support the development of building level EOPs.

- The department has executed the procurement of the Safety Training Curriculum Development and Delivery contract with the following objectives:
  1. Training curriculum based on national and state policy and best practices in a variety of formats to include an instructor guide for the school safety mentors to present from. These trainings will enable district level and school level administrators as well as school level staff to understand their role in school safety, security, intervention, prevention, and emergency preparedness planning.
  2. Continuation and improvements to the Tennessee School Safety Mentor Program, which represent diverse areas of expertise, located throughout each grand division, who will be available to assist districts in meeting needs identified through the security assessment and compliance monitoring processes in place or currently being developed.

3. Revision and launch of the Tennessee School Safety Specialist (TSSSP) program which incorporates the elements described above and is focused upon establishing a cadre of trained school personnel across the state.
  4. Training evaluations aligned with established state and federal training evaluation and reporting requirements.
  5. It is the department's intent that the three support elements identified above shall interface in such a way as to support the broad dissemination of best practices in school emergency operations and long-term sustainability.
- The department has revised the [District Level Emergency Operation Template](#) and the [School Level Emergency Operation Template](#) to include a new cybersecurity, threat assessment and transportation annexes.
  - The department has conducted this year's EOP Review for District and School Emergency Operations Plans for LEAs that were selected for review in the 2021-22 school year utilizing the District EOP Review Rubric and the School EOP Review Rubric. The school safety mentors reviewed 27 District Level EOPs and 52 School Level EOPs. Each school and district EOP were reviewed by 2 safety mentors for a total of 158 reviews. Consultation meetings will be held among the safety mentors who conducted the reviews to determine feedback that needs to be given to the LEAs in April. Virtual feedback meetings will be held with LEA's in need of corrective action plans in May. EPOs feedback reports will be given to all LEAs.   - The department has also conducted this year's Drill Log Review in which drill logs for 2020-21 school year were reviewed for 392 schools in 27 districts.

**Objective C:** Define the role of the school resource officer and the first responder community in assisting schools in the development of building level EOPs and develop training and resources to support that role.

- The department has executed the procurement of the SRO Training Development and Delivery contract with the following objectives:
  - Develop a 40-hour basic training for new SROs that includes:
    - School Resource Officer Overview and Leading Practices
    - Engaging the School Community
    - Current Trends in School Crime and Contributing Factors
    - Legal Aspects
    - Special Education
    - Memorandum of Understanding
    - School Building Security, CPTED, and Leading Practices
    - Emergency Operations Planning
    - Risk Management for After School and Interscholastic Athletics
    - Student Supports
      - Multi-Tiered Systems of Support for students
      - Adverse Childhood Experiences
      - Mental Health Challenges and Suicide Prevention
      - School Climate and Culture
      - Bullying Response and Prevention

- Restorative Practices
  - De-Escalation Tips
  - Averting Targeted School Violence and Threat Assessments
- Develop a 16-hour training for annual training for all SROs that includes:
  - Restorative Practices
  - Youth Mental Health First Aid
  - Trauma Informed Practices
  - Threat Assessment
  - CPTED
  - Emergency Operations Planning
  - Transportation Safety Planning
  - Security Assessments
- The trainings have been developed and the department is seeking POST Approval from Law Enforcement. The department plans on scheduling trainings this year and has already conducted Youth Mental Health First Aid for SROs from 8 counties.

**Objective D:** Research best practices and develop a framework or template for integrating student transportation operations into district and school-level EOP processes and create training resources for transportation supervisors and drivers.

- The department is in the process of developing a Student Transportation Safety Plan to include the following:
  - Preparedness
    - Inspections
    - Communications
    - Emergency Kits
    - Emergency Drills
  - Response
    - Functional procedures to include shelter in place, drop cover and hold, evacuation procedures, and student accountability and release procedures.
    - Threats and hazards include critical medical emergency, non-critical medical emergency, bus transfer, fire, collision or crash, and downed power lines.
- The school safety contract will include the development of training for bus drivers that is aligned with the student transportation safety plan.

**Objective E:** Maintain a partnership infrastructure that will facilitate collaboration and ensure sustainability beyond the grant period.

- The department has a formal relationship with Commerce and Insurance to ensure accountability for our drills.
- The department has developed a formal relationship with Tennessee Emergency Management Agency to collaborate on emergency preparedness for schools and to coordinate response for school emergencies.

- The department has developed informal relationships with the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security for development, training and monitoring of school security assessments.
- The department has also developed informal relationships with the Tennessee Department of Health and Tennessee Department of Mental Health for the development of resources and information.

**Department Goals for the remaining project year 5 are the following:**

- Conduct the Tennessee School Safety Academy Program training to provide information on national and state best practices, as well as exemplary resources for school safety, security, intervention and prevention, and emergency preparedness planning. The Department anticipated outcomes are the implementation of school safety practices that promote the development of safe and supportive learning environments for all students and staff. The Department’s goal is that each district will have a School Safety Specialist that will be responsible for the following responsibilities and activities:
  - Coordinate the review, editing, and updating of Emergency Operations Plans for their district and school each year as established under T.C.A. 49-6-(801-814)
  - Train school-level safety teams on the training, real-world use, and revision of emergency operations plans.
  - Network with appropriate stakeholders to enhance school safety at the district or school level.
- Conduct school resource officer trainings that incorporate elements of emergency planning to include:
  - Memorandums of Understanding
  - Emergency Operations Planning
  - Understanding and Working Effectively with Students with Special Needs
  - SRO Role in Security and Threat Assessments

***Transportation***

Since implementation of T.C.A. § 49-6-2116, the department has hired a director and a consultant to oversee training and monitoring associated with the district transportation requirements. The department’s transportation staff are responsible for overseeing support in training and compliance, and for recommending school bus specifications. Significant accomplishments in this area include:

- **Training-** Transportation supervisor training guidance has been developed and shared with LEAs to clarify the training process and supervisor obligations. Student Transportation Management Training has been developed and is currently being offered as on-demand courses for transportation supervisors. All supervisor training is being tracked and certified.



- **Compliance-** A monitoring system is in place to ensure compliance with state and federal pupil transportation requirements. To date, 115 compliance visits have been completed.
- **Specifications-** The Tennessee State Board of Education approved updated school bus specifications based on the department's recommendations on September 18, 2019.
- **Bus Driver Shortage-** In 2022, the department conducted a bus driver shortage study. This study included the collection of 60 data points from 122 transportation supervisors, 5 in-person listening sessions, and the development of 13 strategies to help districts mitigate the impacts of their driver shortages.

In addition, the department is currently administering a \$3 million appropriation to establish a school bus seat restraint grant program. The program reimburses districts for the additional cost associated with adding seat restraints when purchasing new buses or retrofitting qualifying buses already in operation. Nineteen districts have been awarded grant funding to place 102 buses in service that are equipped with seat restraints.

### ***School Safety Index***

Serious incidents related to student behavior in Tennessee schools are tracked via the department's student management information system. For the purposes of this report, the department has developed a measure entitled the School Safety Index which includes those serious incidents deemed to be most directly related to the safety and welfare of students, including the following:

- Possession of a handgun
- Possession of a rifle or shotgun
- Possession of an explosive or incendiary device
- Possession of a weapon other than a firearm
- Assault of a teacher or staff member
- Assault of a student
- Sexual assault
- Aggravated assault of a teacher or staff member
- Aggravated assault of a student
- Attempted homicide

The table below indicates serious incident totals for school years 2017-18 through 2021-22. Due to the significant reduction in the number of days in which students were on campus as a

result of COVID-19 school closures, the data demonstrates a reduction in serious incidents. For that reason, the 2019-20 and 2021-22 data are not comparable.

In order to arrive at a school-level measure, the total number of the above incidents that have been reported for the school year via the student management information system are divided by a school's average daily membership (ADM) to arrive at a school safety index score. Scores for any schools reporting one or more serious incidents during the 2021-22 school year, aggregated by school district, are included in [Appendix IV](#).

Using the same formula (i.e., serious incidents/ADM) to review Tennessee as a whole, the aggregate school safety index for Tennessee is presented below. Again, due to the significant reduction in the number of days in which students were actually on campus as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic school closures, 2019-20 and 2020-21 data is not comparable.

## ***Road Ahead***

As the Governor's Enhanced School Safety Working Group continues to meet, school safety will continue to be a priority. A particular focus for the 2021-22 school year includes school climate, trainings, and supporting school resource officer programs. Specific steps currently being taken include:

- 1) Develop and provide training and technical assistance on school climate and its relationship to safety to include threat assessment.
- 2) Develop new content for upcoming school safety trainings.
- 3) Ensure School Resource Officers (SRO) are well-trained and compliant with T.C.A. 49-6-4217.

## Appendix IV: 2021-22 School Safety Index

Description: T.C.A. § 49-6-4301 states that “the commissioner shall report to the governor and the General Assembly concerning the prevalence of violent and disruptive incidents in public schools.” To fulfill this legislative mandate, the department has developed the School Safety Index. For each school, the reported sum of serious school safety incidents is divided by the school’s average daily membership (ADM) to arrive at a percentage of enrollment or School Safety Index score. A higher index score indicates a relatively higher level of reported incidents. Schools that did not report any of the serious incidents identified below will not appear in the index:

- Possession of a handgun
- Possession of a rifle or shotgun
- Possession of an explosive or incendiary device
- Possession of a weapon other than a firearm
- Assault of a teacher or staff member
- Assault of a student
- Sexual assault
- Aggravated assault of a teacher or staff member
- Aggravated assault of a student
- Attempted homicide
