Savannah native graduates infantry training

SAVANNAH, Tenn. – Pfc. James Harville graduated from the Army’s One Station Unit Training, qualifying as an infantryman, at Fort Benning, Georgia, January 15.

During this mentally and physically taxing training program, OSUT combines the Army’s Basic Combat Training and Advanced Individual Training into a 22-week course. Harville was trained to capture, destroy, and deter enemy forces. Infantrymen are the fighting force of the Army. Harville is now assigned to C Troop, 1st Squadron, 278th Armored Cavalry Regiment, in Clarksville.

Harville, a Hardin County High School graduate, plans to further his education while serving in the Tennessee National Guard.

“I am going to utilize my educational benefits with the Tennessee STRONG Act and the GI Bill so I can pursue my Bachelor’s and Master’s Degrees and graduate debt free,” said Harville.
