



## **Child Fatality Review Prevention Planning Tool**



Each year 800 children die in Tennessee and many of these deaths are preventable. A death is considered preventable if an individual or community could have reasonably done something that would have changed the circumstances leading to a child's death. While the loss of any child is tragic; CFR has the opportunity to shift the focus of reviews by using information learned from tragedy to prevent future child deaths.

There are three levels of prevention – primary, secondary and tertiary prevention. Primary prevention is directed at preventing an act with risk for injury or death from occurring. Secondary prevention is directed at reducing the effect of the injury after it has occurred. Tertiary prevention is directed at reducing the severity of an injury after it has occurred.

For the purposes of this tool, our focus is to prevent childhood injuries through primary prevention. Of course, certain primary prevention efforts will also provide secondary prevention, reducing the risk for injury if an incident does occur.

On the following pages, you will find helpful information – including prevention ideas for most of the indicators that Tennessee's CFR program reports on – to help support your prevention work.

### **A. Identifying Modifiable Risk Factors**

Conducting a thorough review of each death helps teams to focus on specific factors that caused the death or the unfortunate circumstances that disposed the child to harm. Once such factors have been identified, the team should decide whether they believe the factors can be modified.

Once modifiable risk factors have been identified; it then becomes equally important for teams to assess the extent of the problem and who it most impacts. To have a greater impact, it may be ideal to plan prevention activities with a focus on populations of children at increased risk.

### **B. Determining the Best Strategies for Prevention**

There are many tools that can be utilized to help guide prevention efforts. One such strategy is the *Spectrum of Prevention* model. The Spectrum of Prevention, developed by Larry Cohen, MSW in 1983, is a comprehensive framework that describes seven levels at which prevention activities can take place. This tool challenges us to develop programs and activities beyond teaching healthy behaviors; but it also reminds us that while public health problems are oftentimes complex, all prevention efforts do not necessarily require funding or intense planning.
