2014 CINCO DE MAYO HOLIDAY

12:00 AM, FRIDAY, MAY 2, THROUGH 11:59 PM, MONDAY, MAY 5, 2014
96-HOUR HOLIDAY PERIOD

In Tennessee, there were 15 fatal crashes resulting in 16 deaths, yielding a fatality rate of one death every 6 hours.

Twelve of the crashes were single vehicle crashes and **three** crashes were multi-vehicle crashes.

Seven of the 16 fatalities (43.8%) occurred in alcohol-related crashes.

Fifteen of the fatalities were vehicle occupants (12 driver and three passenger).

- Seven of the 16 (43.8%) were not wearing safety restraints.
- One pedestrians was killed.
- No child passengers were killed.
- Five motorcyclists were killed.
