Special Requirements by Type:

Type 100 - Free Annual Resident Senior Citizen Commercial Fishing License

This type is issued at no charge to those residents 70 years old or older who furnish proof of residency and age. This license expires every year on the last day of February. Holders of this license must apply yearly.

Types 103, 104, 106 and 107

Nonresident Commercial licenses will only be issued to applicants from states that allow Tennessee residents these same privileges. My signature on this application indicates I have received, for my information and use, a copy of *Tennessee Commercial Fishing* and/or *Tennessee Commercial Musseling* (whichever was appropriate to the license applied for). These publications provide a synopsis of Tennessee's laws governing commercial fishing and musseling, including waters closed to commercial fishing due to contamination.

Types 108 and 110 - Resident or Nonresident Commercial Roe Fish Harvester Permit

One of these types must be purchased in addition to a Type 100, 101 or 103 if you intend to harvest any part of a fish that is classified as a "roe species" by the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Commission. These licenses expire every year on the last day of February.

Types 111 and 112 - Resident or Nonresident Wholesale Roe Fish Purchaser Permit

One of these types must be purchased in addition to a Type 113 if you intend to purchase any part of a fish that is classified as a "roe species" by the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Commission. These licenses expire every year on the last day of February.

Type 116 - Nonresident Fish Dealer

This license type is required for all nonresident bait dealers, catch-out operators and fish farmers who wish to sell fish in Tennessee.

Type 119 - Resident/Nonresident Commercial Bow License

This license does not require that it be held in combination with a resident/non-resident commercial fishing license (Types 100, 101 or 103). This type is issued at no charge to a resident or non-resident interested in harvesting silver, bighead and grass carp with a bow for the purpose of sale. A once-yearly reporting requirement is mandatory for all Type 119 license holders.
