Fire Service and Codes Academy. The only thing I'll mention is we graduated 23 recruits last week. The discussion around HAZMAT during the last meeting, we did have -- So when we went back to campus after that, we had three retake it, and I think one of those three passed with a new test. And then -- so we had talked about having that whole group of recruits retake this new test just as sort of a test group. So I think on Thursday we had 17.

Basically, I just told them what was going on and asked them to volunteer. So I think I had 17 out of the group volunteer to retake that as a test. I don't know the results, but we did have them take it. We will see how that turns out.

CHAIRMAN BIGGS: So we just had them take it just to take it to see how they scored? Not for any reason?

JASON SPARKS: Just to see how they scored. All of those that took it had already passed it.

This was -- because, obviously, the three that failed it to begin with might not have been the best test group to take it. So we wanted a good representation to see what it looked like.

CHAIRMAN BIGGS: Director, did you get

DIRECTOR CLARK: The results have not

been graded as of right now. There has been some other event in the test grading. We have also had some software issues with the grading that was fixed yesterday. So I should have that information for you. What I will do is email the results out to the Commission.

DIRECTOR CLARK: Yes, sir. We've had a little bit of feedback on when we took the Pro Board letter out with the date of April 30, we were no longer going to send Pro Board letters out. I, myself, have gotten some feedback, and AC Farley, if we could ask Assistant Commissioner Farley.

ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FARLEY: Well, I am the reason that this was asked to be put on the agenda today. I have received phone calls from chiefs and other people with concerns about this. What I'd like to do, being that Shane is new and really didn't have any input or whatever or conversations into the Pro Board thing, and with -- Fred went to the Pro Board conference and was going to have a conversation with someone, but they didn't talk to him. I want to have Shane be able to have a conversation with Pro Board to find out what is actually, you know, being said. And that way he can come back and

have more knowledge of it. That way, postpone this April 30th deadline where he can have a discussion with them. He has actually contacted them and they want to have a conversation with him. I'd like to postpone it with no date. That way, we can come back later on, after we find out, and make a decision after he has discussions with Pro Board.

CHAIRMAN BIGGS: Director Elliott?

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ELLIOTT: Just going to say, so, in other words, your awareness and ops, if they are still going to be tested underneath the International Association, that wouldn't affect them because they are still going to get that -- Pro Board you can get reciprocity. And just to make sure you know what they are saying, your curriculum is still approved. It just means the fire -- in y'all's case, your Firefighter I test questions would be validated to Jones and Bartlett rather than IFSTA. I just want to make sure you know we are not saying your curriculum isn't approved.

HEATHER ZIMMERMAN: So we can still use

20 them?

21 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ELLIOTT: Yes.

22 (Cross-talk.)

DIRECTOR CLARK: You can still use whatever you want to. The only thing that this affects is the Commission testing. So we are -- our tests will be

from the Jones and Bartlett curriculum, but you are more than welcome to still use the IFSTA manuals, whatever you want to, in your curriculum. Just know the Commission test will be coming from Jones and Bartlett. Right now, and I don't know if you know this. Let me give you just a little bit of -- what was happening is because we didn't have a specific book to test from, we were having to make tests from two different textbooks. So what we are trying to do is eliminate that where we are only using test banks from one book per whatever discipline it is. Okay. So, no, it doesn't affect what you do on your own. It's just the Commission is going to test from Jones and Bartlett.

when we are running into this situation where we are having

a test where we are seeing a failure rate go -- sky rocket,

we need to track these questions. We need to see if these

are the same questions being missed by every single person

that's creating this fail.

CHAIRMAN BIGGS: Yeah.

COMMISSIONER SCOTT: And, at that point, take action to remove those questions because it could be bad questions.

DIRECTOR CLARK: So we were not, per se, tracking each individual question. If we do have

somebody that says it's a bad question, obviously, we are looking at it from that standpoint. What -- the biggest issue, that now we can really track some questions, is we only had 10 questions. So now that we have 25 questions, I think we will be able to actually track some questions a lot better and have a better knowledge of what's being missed.

COMMISSIONER COBB: I have a question about the data, if we could. Is there a way we could ask the departments are they teaching from IFSTA, are they teaching from Jones and Bartlett, or are they using FEMA?

CHAIRMAN BIGGS: We have been down that road, and it's hard to get the people to tell you what they are doing. You have seven hundred and something fire departments and to try to get that information...

LEIGH FERGUSON: Can you ask it on the test from the test taker? Would they know?

CHAIRMAN BIGGS: I mean, I guess we

probably could ask them, but, I mean, it would be hard. You could put question 101 (cross-talk). 3 DIRECTOR CLARK: It would be hard for 4 us to grade that. What we could do is do, like, an end of test question or something like that. DIRECTOR CLARK: Yes. The HMO through IFF, they have a great pass rate, from what it looks like, based on the numbers that come in to us for reciprocity.
