OLD BUSINESS

Commissioner Bast reports that the legislation to drop the required insurance from \$50,000.00 to \$25,000.00 passed the Senate Finance Committee despite strong opposition from the Hospital Industry. Next week the legislation will be heard on the House floor.

<u>Martial Arts Tournaments</u>. Commissioner Bast suggests that we should look at charging a permit fee for Martial arts Tournaments. That it would be good to keep track of the events and require them to provide an emergency safety plan.

<u>Pro Wrestling</u>. Executive Director Mullen states that pro wrestling needs to be regulated. The commission asks Director Mullen to research the regulation of pro wrestling in neighboring states

New Business

Commissioner Bast states that there is no need for an office for Director Mullen and the commission could save \$4200.00 per year by eliminating it. Director Mullen agrees. The commission decides to delay a vote on it until the next meeting.

Commissioner Bast and Commissioner Hannah state that we need to stress economic impact to the State at the Sunset Hearing. She asks Dr. Fitch if he could ask Vanderbilt about the possibility of Vanderbilt Students creating an economic impact study. He agrees to look into it.
