#### 1. Case No.: 2017038151

This is a consumer complaint alleging a dispute of the payment for funeral services which based on the complaint stems from a disagreement between family members about which funeral home to use. There was a delay in receiving the death certificate due to issues at the hospital but were resolved within a month from the date of death, and there was some confusion over the number of certified copies of the death certificate to be received by the family. There was also a claim filed against the estate which has been resolved; but as a result of the claim being filed, one family member states that there may have been a forgery of a name. However, the claim has been resolved by another family member who signed the contract, and there is no evidence of any forgery.

## Recommendation:

- Close

## 2. Case No.: 2017039061

This is a consumer complaint alleging that a death certificate was not timely filed. In response, the funeral home states that the prior owner of the funeral home failed to file the death certificate. The current owner is assisting with delayed filing of the death certificate; however, the doctor who treated the deceased is retired and cannot be located. The funeral home is working with the hospital to obtain the death certificate.

This is complaint alleged by a former employee of the Respondent funeral home alleging an ethnic slur was made about the Complainant. The Complainant was terminated on the same day as the alleged ethnic slur was made. Both the funeral home manager and marketing director provided written responses disputing the allegations and stating that the employee was terminated for performance issues. The statement was not made directly to the Complainant but supposedly to another employee of the funeral home who executed an affidavit which does not substantiate the claims.

## PERFORMANCE AUDIT UPDATE:

The Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury, Division of State Audit, has completed a Performance and Compliance Audit for the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers and seven (7) other regulatory boards within the Department of Commerce and Insurance.

The report is intended to aid the Joint Government Operations Committee in its review to determine whether the regulatory boards should be continued, restructured, or terminated.

There were no negative prior or current audit findings or observations contained within this report that were specific to the Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers.

A formal hearing was held pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act against Respondent Bartlett Funeral Home, Inc. and Alfred Thomas Tacker following formal charges being authorized by the Board. Administrative Judge Michael Begley presided. The State was represented by Sara R. Page, and the Respondents were represented by Bruce D. Brooke of Memphis, TN. The subject of the hearing was the proposed revocation of Alfred Thomas Tacker's funeral director license number 2773, and Bartlett Funeral Home, Inc. establishment license number 1005.

After consideration of the testimony and evidence, the Board entered a Final Order for the following discipline:

- Alfred Thomas Tacker, the Board revoked Funeral Director license number 2773 and assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$8000.
- Bartlett Funeral Home, Inc., the Board suspended Establishment license number 2773 for six (6) months, assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$8000, and costs.
