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Operations Committee at the Tennessee General
Assembly. Should such an event occur, it would be up
there that the General Assembly would ask why the
Commission has been in the red for two years, a plan for addressing it. They might also take the opportunity to decide whether they wanted to take more drastic changes to the regulation of the industry.

So as to your question about what could happen, that could be the ultimate outcome, that there would be two consecutive fiscal years in the red, which would trigger that hearing. It is also possible that this year, which is supposed to be one of the positive fiscal years, will in fact turn out to be that way, and you will have one year in the black and one year in the red over the two-year accounting period, which would not trigger such a hearing, and the Commission would be able to carry on with business as usual.

To try and meet that goal, you have obviously authorized the meeting of just four times per year, which will lower your expenses. Cody and I have worked on some other things to try to lower the Commission expenses. So, for example, over the years the number of staff people who work on this program
has altered. Cody oversees a large staff, and we have reallocated those staff members so that the program is not getting billed for staff that are not working on this any more.

So just yesterday, I had a meeting with fiscal in order to look at what the impact is currently on that, and after that discussion, decided that I want to retroactively apply that from the beginning of this fiscal year forward. So if we were to do that, the monthly payroll costs will drop from about $\$ 11,000$ per month to roughly $\$ 6,000$ per month. So if we reallocate that from Jluly, the start of the fiscal year, through September, and leave things as they currently are, payroll costs will be about $\$ 72,000$ in fiscal year 2019, which is significantly less and the 134,000 that was charged in the previous fiscal year.

So all that to say, I think that it is likely that the Commission is going to end up in the black for the year. It's not guaranteed, but --

MR. BAYNE: For FY-19.
MR. LAWRENCE: That's correct, yes. Not guaranteed, but I think it's likely.

MR. BAYNE: The question then is, is being in the red over a 24 -month period or being in

1 the red over a 12-month period and then being in the red the following sequential 12 months, that would trigger a review?

MR. LAWRENCE: It's only two consecutive
MR. BAYNE: Two consecutive years.

MR. BAYNE: Closeouts. Triggering a review does not necessarily mean a decision to -- it simply means, let's figure out what we can do about this.

MR. LAWRENCE: Absolutely. So if that were to happen, you could end up -- you would end up in the Joint Operations Committee, in which they would ask what do you need to do in order to get back into the black. So for some other programs, that has meant reevaluating fees, it has also meant evaluating what is regulated in order to try and get the program back into profitability.

MR. BAYNE: Good. Good. Trust you are familiar with the survey that Ms. Vest undertook resulting in discovery that Tennessee renewals is among the lowest in the universe of our survey. I think that we do have some options.
clarity and transparency everything that goes into it.

You may be aware of STS, which is our IT.
STS is something that happens at a level far above my
pay grade and there are fees that come down to us
that we have no flexibility of covering. It's just
something that we have to do and part of that is in
Edison. Something else that is in Edison would be the rent that the Commission has to pay. Another thing that is currently inflexible -- although, I will, just as a foretaste of things to come, Cody has likely told you about the AWS initiative, which is in which employees work from home three days a week. We are over a year into that program and just now starting the second phase, which is a real estate reallocation. So the -- our division, which was currently spread out over two floors, is about on half of a floor now, and the entire department is going through a renovation of the building. And when that happens, we are going to be able to lower our rent pretty substantially. We don't have the final numbers as to what that's going to be, but I mention that just as something that's coming. But that is also in the category of Edison, and that's something that I am unable to impact, Cody is similarly unable

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to impact.
So to your broader question about Edison, it's not as transparent as it should be, I'm working to make that happen. We are trying to control all of the expenses that we can within it. But I admit it, is not perfect right now, and we are trying to move in that direction.

MR. ROUSSEAU: Thank you.
MR. BAYNE: Is there a -- Cody, are there any months or portions of the fiscal year that are bringing in more dollars, more renewals, in a period of time? Per quarter, for example?

MS. VEST: Without looking at the figures, I am going to tell you yes. It's probably more people renewing in the first of the year, February, March, April.

MR. BAYNE: I see.
MR. LAWRENCE: So I have that historical data in front of me, I don't think Cody has in front of her. So the relevant year to look at would be fiscal year '17, so we are looking back at an odd fiscal year to compare it against fiscal year '19. And there are some months that show significantly higher revenue than other months. So, for example, October of '17 was very high, as was January. There
are a couple of really high months that historically
have been high, and that's something we will be watching very closely throughout this year to see if because we are in a fiscal year that should be higher, whether those high months from fiscal year ' 17 will match with ' 19 as well, which will give a pretty good indication of where we are going to close out for the year.

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MS. VEST: Well, that's the East
Tennessee Human Resource Agency? Well, we can reach out to them.
MR. BAYNE: I think that would be great.
MS. VEST: This is the first one I have seen.
MR. BROWN: It's a post-approved program, so I have no trouble with that at all. That's encouraging. But if they can get into our system where other folks could take advantage of it, you know, I think it would be worthwhile.
MS. VEST: Okay. We'll table this one, we'll make some attempts at corresponding with her, get some more information, and bring it back to the January meeting.
The second one we have here is the Hetherington Group, H-E-T-H-E-R-I-N-G-T-O-N. I don't know how you pronounce that.
CHAIRMAN VALENTINE: Hetherington.
MS. VEST: Hetherington. Thank you.
CHAIRMAN VALENTINE: I do know her and I know of her company.
MS. VEST: Okay. What they are asking, she did some webinars here, would be like to be an approved vendor. You did get all that material to

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approve this -- her company as a vendor. And, of course, she wants these courses approved too.

MR. BROWN: I have no problem with them at all.
