DATA COLLECTION (115.388)

The RLBJSC will collect accurate, uniform data for every allegation of sexual abuse at the RLBJSC using a standardized instrument and set of definitions as instructed by the PREA Coordinator.

RLBJSC will aggregate the incident-based sexual abuse data at least annually.

The incident-based data collected will include, at a minimum, the data necessary to answer all questions from the most recent version of the SURVEY OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE conducted by the Department of Justice.

RLBJSC will maintain, review, and collect data as needed from all available incident-based documents, including reports, investigation files, and sexual abuse incident reviews.

RLBJSC will submit incident-based and aggregated data to DCS from the previous calendar year by June 1^{st} of each year.

DATA REVIEW FOR CORRECTIVE ACTION (115.388)

RLBJSC will review data collected and aggregated pursuant to PREA standards 115.387 in order to access and improve the effectiveness of the sexual abuse prevention, detection, and response policies, practices, and training, including,

- Identifying problem areas
- Taking corrective action on an ongoing basis and
- Preparing an annual report of its findings and corrective actions

The report will include a comparison of the current year's data and corrective actions with those from prior years and will provide an assessment of the RLBJSC's progress in addressing sexual abuse.

The RLBJSC report will be approved by the Superintendent and made readily available to the public through its website or through other means, as applicable.

The RLBJSC may redact specific material from the report when publication would present a clear and specific threat to the safety and security of its facility but must indicate the nature of the material redacted.

DATA STORAGE, PUBLICATION, AND DESTRUCTION

RLBJSC will ensure that data collected pursuant to PREA standards 115.387 securely retained.

RLBJSC will make all aggregated sexual abuse data readily available to the public at least annually by providing said data to the PREA Program Manager.

RLBJSC will maintain sexual abuse data collected pursuant to PREA standard 115.387 or at least ten (10) years after the date of the initial collection unless Federal, State, or local law requires otherwise.
