

Third Grade Retention: Ground 1 Appeal Recommendation Form

Pursuant to T.C.A. § 49-6-3115 and State Board of Education (SBE) Rule 0520-01-03-.16, the parent or legal guardian of a student who is identified for retention in third grade based on the student's achieving a performance level rating of "approaching" on the ELA portion of the student's most recent TCAP test, may appeal directly to the Department.

Requirements for a Ground 1 appeal include:

- The parent or legal guardian of the student agrees they were provided notice of all requirements of a Ground 1 appeal and agrees that their student will comply with all requirements of a Ground 1 appeal if retention is overturned.
- For the 2023-24 academic year, the student scores at or above the fortieth (40th)
 percentile on a SBE- approved universal reading screener administered by the LEA or
 public charter school.
- The principal of the student's school agrees to develop an academic remediation plan, in coordination with the student's teachers, IEP or 504 team if applicable, for the student. The academic remediation plan shall include evidence-based strategies and input from the student's parents and other appropriate school personnel.
- The student's current ELA teacher and school principal provide a unanimous recommendation that the student be promoted to the 4th grade.
- The student's LEA or public charter school agrees to provide high-dosage low-ratio tutoring services to the student for the entirety of the student's fourth (4th) grade year.

To file a Ground 1 appeal, a parent or legal guardian, or a school official who has received written consent on behalf of the parent or legal guardian, can submit an appeal form at the Department's <u>Learning Acceleration</u> page.

When submitting the appeal, the submitter will need to upload the following signature page completed by the student's principal and ELA teacher to show agreement to the stated requirements for the appeal.
