MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between Tennessee Department of Agriculture and Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is made and entered into upon the latter date of execution signed below between **Tennessee Department of Agriculture** (TDA) and **Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation** (TDEC), collectively the "Parties."

WHEREAS, TDEC is the state agency responsible for abatement of ground and surface water quality impairments, reclamation of impaired waters, and prevention of future impairments of state waters:

WHEREAS, TDEC is empowered to exercise general supervision and control over the quality of all state waters and to administer and to enforce all laws and regulations relating to impairments of such waters, consistent with the purposes of the Water Quality Control Act of 1977, Tenn. Code Ann. § 69-3-101 to -148;

WHEREAS, certain agricultural or silvicultural operations may generate point source discharges when an operator fails to attend to best management practices;

WHEREAS, operators who generate point source discharges are periodically engaged with TDA through either pesticide regulation or receipt of technical or financial assistance for implementation of best management practices through the Division of Forestry or Land and Water Stewardship Section;

WHEREAS, under Tenn. Code Ann. § 69-3-120(g) the Water Quality Control Act of 1977 shall not apply to any agricultural or forestry activity unless the activity is associated with a point source discharge from a discernible, confined, and discrete water conveyance:

WHEREAS, TDEC is the sole state agency authorized to conduct investigations under the Water Quality Control Act of 1977, provided that other state agencies may assist in duties arising under the Act and TDA shall be notified of any investigations under the Act associated with agricultural or silvicultural activities; and

THEREFORE, premises considered, TDA and TDEC hereby formally offer their mutual support and understanding to each other for effective and efficient response to water quality impairment concerns in agricultural and silvicultural activities as follows:

- 1. Methods of Cooperation.
 - a. TDEC. TDEC will notify TDA of any matter in which water quality impacts may be associated with agricultural or silvicultural activities.

- i. Agricultural means relating to the production of food or fiber, and silvicultural means relating to the cultivation of trees.
- ii. TDEC will in good faith attempt to notify TDA of water quality matters associated with agricultural or silvicultural activities prior to conducting investigations of those matters.
- iii. In cases where TDA is notified prior to investigation, TDEC will afford in good faith deference and opportunity for TDA to make recommendations and implement resolution efforts for the matter. TDEC may in its sole discretion await TDA recommendations and resolution efforts prior to instituting enforcement actions within TDEC's jurisdiction.
- iv. Following completion of TDA's resolution efforts, TDEC will assume responsibility for any further regulatory oversight or enforcement actions related to the matter.
- v. TDEC will periodically provide guidelines to TDA identifying those circumstances and events generally associated with agricultural and silvicultural activities that may constitute point source discharges.
- b. TDA. For any matter reported by TDEC, TDA will conduct educational outreach and regulatory response within its jurisdiction.
 - i. As workflow and resources permit, and ideally within 15 business days of receiving notification, TDA will evaluate the site and operator activity; institute appropriate resolution and enforcement actions consistent with TDA practice; and provide TDEC with an initial report, recommendations, and anticipated follow-up necessary to verify compliance with the operator.
 - ii. TDA's evaluation of the site shall consider the extent and characteristics of water quality impacts, including impact sources such as skid trails, road construction, gullies, livestock waste handling, pesticide issues, etc. TDA shall also consider the extent to which the operator has implemented best management practices related to the alleged impact. TDA may request on-site consultation with TDEC in order to accurately assess water quality impacts, including a determination of actual or potential nonpoint and point source discharges, if any.
 - iii. In TDA's sole discretion, TDA efforts to resolve the matter may include educational outreach, warnings, civil penalties, withdrawal of grant or program funding, revocation of licenses issued by TDA, pursuit of injunctive relief, and institution of criminal charges.
 - iv. Upon completion of resolution efforts, TDA will notify TDEC of all resolution efforts and related documents issued to the operator and

- will advise of recommendations whether TDA considers the matter resolved or outstanding.
- v. For any matter not resolved within 180 days following notification and any matter TDA deems to be an egregious or chronic violation of best management practices or regulations within TDA's jurisdiction, TDA may end resolution efforts for the matter and recommend TDEC enforcement, if any.
- vi. TDA will make good faith efforts to resolve water quality concerns in agricultural and silvicultural settings only. TDA will not endeavor to represent or to act in lieu of TDEC with regard to water quality concerns.
- c. For notification purposes, the Parties will contact each other using Attachments A and B to this MOU. The Parties agree to submit reports and information in mutually acceptable electronic formats, if possible.
- d. TDEC and TDA will attempt in good faith, as workflow permits and in each party's individual and sole discretion, to provide annual instruction to their respective personnel as appropriate for engagement under this MOU.
- 2. Compensation. The Parties agree that no compensation will be paid or will be required for any services or assets made available to them under this MOU.
- 3. Liability. The Parties agree to assume individually the total and sole responsibility for any action or omission of their individual employees and agents arising out of this MOU.
- 4. Periodic Review. The Parties agree to evaluate periodically and as often as necessary the desirability of continuing this MOU and to revise its terms as the Parties deem appropriate. Amendment or addendum of this MOU may be had only upon the written agreement of both Parties; however, the Parties agree that contact information provided in Attachments A and B may be updated upon notice to the other party without need of executing an amendment to this MOU.
- 5. Term. The Parties agree that this MOU shall operate continually and that its termination may be had with or without cause by either party upon submission of a 30-day written notice of termination.
- 6. Departmental Discretion. The Parties agree that nothing within this MOU may be construed to limit either party's discretion or authority to investigate and administer responses to violations within its jurisdiction.
- 7. Effect. The Parties agree that this MOU supersedes all existing memoranda of understanding between them, including any supplements or amendments thereto, with respect to coordinated response efforts for water quality concerns in the state. The Parties further agree that nothing in this MOU is intended to represent nor shall it operate as a binding contract between the parties, and rather this MOU is simply a formal statement of the Parties' intended good will and support for one another.
