

Homeless Youth: What You Can Do

Families can be a big source of holiday stress, but being without a family means not only lacking family financial supports but lacking emotional supports. An estimated 4.2 million young people, including youth (13-17 year-olds) and young adults (18-25 year-olds) experience homelessness each year. The Youth Transitions Advisory Council is made up of agencies working to help reduce

homelessness in youth who have aged out of foster care and are at higher risk of becoming homeless.

Funding and Support Information

AmeriCorp and other volunteer programs are underutilized in poorer rural areas, in part because the stipends and other supports, like housing, they provide are inadequate, according to the Pew Charitable Trust. Efforts are underway to make these programs more available.

The <u>Rebuild Rural America Act</u> proposes the creation of a Rural Future Corps to help rural communities improve child care, health services and job training, among other things. A bill summary says, "specific efforts would be included to retain the Corps members in the rural areas after their service." If passed, this could provide resources for rural service providers.




