25. Fall from Roof

A 41-year-old roofer fell approximately 18 feet from the roof of a residential structure, striking his head on a trailer jack. The employees were removing old roof shingles and replacing them with new shingles and roofing accessories. The victim stretched a roll of roof vent across the one-story-garage roof, stood up, and fell backwards. He fell and struck his head on the trailer jack that was supporting a trailer containing roof shingles. He was pronounced dead at the scene. No fall protection was used on the job.
