## 24. Fall from Mobile Ladder

A **34-year-old** packaging and filling machine operator died when the mobile ladder she was standing on was struck by a forklift. The employee observed a jam on the overhead conveyor where different conveyor lines merged near where she was working. She obtained a mobile ladder platform that was stationed in the department and moved it to the location where she could access the conveyor and unjam the product. She placed the ladder platform in the powered industrial truck aisle, ascended the ladder, and reached over to the jammed boxes and freed them. At the same time she was on the mobile ladder platform, another employee was transporting two pallet loads of product to the warehouse using a forklift. He was operating the forklift in reverse because the load on the forks was high enough to obstruct his forward view. Just as the victim was descending the mobile ladder, the forklift came down the aisle and ran into the ladder. The ladder platform was knocked over and struck a guard post, which threw the victim onto the floor. First responders and paramedics attended the victim and transported her to the hospital, but she received fatal injuries.


