What is Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention?

More commonly called "CBCAP", Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention refers to specific types of child abuse prevention programs that exist in every U.S. state. Funding for CBCAP is distributed by the Administration of Children, Youth and Families for primary and secondary prevention activities.

How are CBCAP programs used in Tennessee?

Tennessee's CBCAP program uses CBCAP funds to administer two prevention programs through 40 child abuse prevention contracts among 25 community-based agencies across Tennessee:

- *Nurturing Parenting Program*: This program is a family-centered initiative designed to build nurturing parenting skills as an alternative to abusive and neglectful parenting and child-rearing practices. This program includes a wide variety of modules designed for specific at-risk populations including teen parents, military families, parents/caregivers of disabled children, first time parents, and parents/caregivers recovering from substance abuse, to name a few. - *Darkness to Light's Stewards of Children*: This is an evidence-based sexual abuse prevention training program designed to educate adults to recognize, prevent, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse and motivates caregivers to courageous action. This 3-hour, discussion-based training is administered by trained facilitators. More information can be found at <http://www.d2l.org/>.

Who is eligible to receive CBCAP-funded services?

Any person free of abuse history or suspicion of abuse is eligible for services. The goal of primary and secondary prevention services is to inform and educate before abuse or neglect has occurred. Families or individuals with a history of perpetrating abuse or neglect or who are under active investigation by DCS are not eligible to receive CBCAP services. However, families or individuals who have simply come into contact with DCS but are not eligible for services through DCS may receive CBCAP-funded services. As long as allegations of abuse or neglect are unfounded and services are not required, a family or individual can be referred for CBCAP services. CBCAP services are voluntary.

How would someone access CBCAP services?

This directory lists all Tennessee community-based agencies contracted to deliver prevention programs through Nurturing Parenting or Stewards of Children. Organized by county, the user can identify which agency offers what program in a specific county. The following agency pages detail each agency's contact information and the prevention activity administered. Additionally, each program can be found online using the "Find TN State Services" service search on www.kidcentraltn.com.

Program Description:	The Parent Stress Training Program (PST) seeks to: reduce parent stress, which is known to be a contributing factor to impulsive abuse of children; provide alternatives to corporal punishment for disciplining children; and encourage supportive parent networks. PST implements "Nurturing Parenting," an effective tool for parenting children of all ages. Caregivers are taught the following: stress management, ages & stages of child development, brain development, understanding feelings, building self-worth, praise and encouragement, communicating with respect and other alternatives to spanking. Our purpose as a non-profit agency is reaching out into the serviced communities with needed resources and tools in order to prevent child abuse. Our goal is for caregivers to implement the new skills in order to deal with their children and life stress in healthier ways without acting impulsively or over disciplining.

Program Description: The "Positive Parenting Program" implementation plan uses the Nurturing Parents program curriculum and is based on the "Nurturing Way" approach. The Boys & Girls Clubs of the Mountain Empire addresses the root causes of abuse prior to the 'fact' as primary prevention program. It is easier to defuse the potential for abuse rather than intervene after the fact. A "nurturing" approach creates an atmosphere of loving, helpful parenting techniques rather than abuse-based disciplinary styles. This nurturing paradigm also pre-emptively intervenes with regard to sexual child abuse, as well. When a program of nurturing is taught to, and subsequently adopted by a parent, the incidence of child abuse of all forms decreases dramatically.

Program Description: The Child Advocacy Center of Rutherford County, Inc. is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit agency that serves victims of child abuse, child sexual abuse, drug endangered children, and their non-offending parents, grandparents, and family members. The Child Advocacy Center works as a multidisciplinary team with the Department of Children's Services, law enforcement, and the District Attorney's Office to investigate and prosecute child abuse cases and help children and their families heal from the trauma and victimization of the abuse. Department of Children's Services protects children, law enforcement arrests perpetrators, the District Attorney's Office prosecutes offenders, while the Child Advocacy Center helps children and families heal from the trauma.

Darkness to Light Stewards of Children is a nationwide training initiative based in Charleston, South Carolina designed to train adults how to protect children by teaching them the 5 Steps to Protecting Children from Child Sexual Abuse. The Child Advocacy Center of Rutherford County, Inc. began implementing this community education program free of charge to participants in September 2012. The training is offered in English and Spanish. The CBCAP grant partially funds the Community Education Coordinator's salary.

The Child Advocacy Center set a goal to train 11,575 Rutherford County and Cannon County parents, grandparents, and professionals. This number represents 5% of the adult population in Rutherford and Cannon Counties. In addition to the Community Education Coordinator all of the Child Advocacy Center staff and 10 volunteers are authorized Darkness to Light facilitators. From September 2012 to June 2018, the Darkness to Light community education program trained over 9,352 adults how to protect children from child sexual abuse, and what to do if a child reports abuse to them.

Program Description:	The Exchange Club-Carl Perkins Center provides the Nurturing Parenting program at various locations across rural West Tennessee. The Nurturing Parenting program is an evidence-based child abuse prevention program that assesses parenting and child rearing beliefs. The program is designed to increase the nurturing skills of participants as well as assess high risk, abusive parenting attitudes and behaviors. The curriculum is implemented in a group setting and supports children being raised in a supportive, nurturing environment. The targeted populations include families at risk of abuse and neglect, parents in recovery for alcohol and drug addiction, families at risk for delinquency, incarcerated parents, low-income families, and self-referrals. Families who have children between the ages of birth and eight will also be targeted for services. Many of these adults have had adverse childhood experiences and are in need of support and parent training. Several partnerships within communities have been established in order to provide the Nurturing Program to the targeted population. The Centers also provide the Stewards of Children child sexual abuse prevention training. This program teaches adults

how to prevent, recognize, and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. The program is designed for individuals concerned about the safety of children as well as organizations who serve youth. A compelling video, the core of the curriculum, includes the vignettes of several courageous survivors of child sexual abuse who have contributed a great deal of time and effort as adults toward ending the cycle of abuse. The Exchange Club-Carl Perkins Center provides numerous child abuse prevention awareness activities, community educational trainings, and implements a child abuse prevention campaign to highlight child abuse prevention month.



Frequency/duration of program: Nurturing Parenting classes includes 3 to 4 days of 4-hour sessions in length which are typically offered in community settings and county jails.

Program Description: Since 1998, Project ENRICH Southwest staff has provided services and supports for individuals with special learning needs in Fayette County. Project ENRICH Southwest is currently the only parenting program that addresses the needs of parents and teen moms with special learning needs in this rural and underserved community. Problems of poverty, isolation, limited educational resources, and access are forerunners of the needs for services in Fayette County. Along with the primary intervention of Nurturing Parenting classes at both the adult and teen level, additional community involvement includes the following:

- Assistance and advocacy at juvenile court, weekly attendance at juvenile court,
- Representation on the Community Advisory Board (CAB) for Fayette County,
- Training and advocacy at local day care centers and Parent Teacher Organizations,

- Coordination of field trips for teens to support continuing education pursuits,
- Participation in health fairs at the local hospital and faith based entities, and
- Counseling interventions with women at Fayette Cares, a local domestic violence residential center for women.

Program Description: Project ENRICH (Shelby) provides a variety of comprehensive services to support the needs of parents or expectant parents with intellectual disabilities or other unique learning needs. Our specific interventions include Nurturing Parenting, Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy for incarcerated caregivers, TF-CBT for individuals, traditional Cognitive Behavior Therapy, Parent-Child Interaction Therapy, Behavior Management, Family Systems Therapy and Social Skills Groups. These services are provided by Masters level clinicians at our center, in the community, and in the home when necessary. Services are available to all communities of Shelby County. In addition to our direct service, we also provide professional state-wide trainings, community outreach, and advocacy. The goals of these interventions are to support and strengthen at-risk caregivers with special learning needs, create healthy parent-child bonds, increase child safety and improve caregivers' ability to support their child's growth, development, and mental health.
